

MAR2013 Certificate II in Maritime Operations (Coxswain Grade 1 NC)

If you have a passion for driving boats, why not get paid for it? The marine industry needs competent crew to transport guests and cargo and to provide services, labour and contracts on the waterfront and on the coast.

This qualification is one component of the eligibility criteria to achieve the Coxswain Grade 1 Certificate of Competency which allows you to work in any state or territory in Australia. You can apply for your certificate by submitting application forms, along with supporting material to a marine safety agency who will process your application on AMSA's behalf.

Coastal vessels

This qualification is suitable for people who work or want to work as a Coxswain Grade 1 in the maritime industry and command a commercial marine vessel:

- up to 12 metres in length
- with propulsion power that is unlimited for an outboard engine or up to 500 kW for an inboard engine
- **carrying passengers** in shore or as a tender or auxiliary vessel within 3 nautical miles (nm) of a parent vessel within the exclusive economic zone (EEZ)

Course fees and duration

All courses are intense, of short duration and include a sea service requirement

- \$2750 includes Long Range Radio Operators Certificate of Proficiency (LROCP) & course text
- Course duration is 10 days, plus 2 days of self-directed study

How to apply

Please complete the commercial course booking form on our website. After receiving your booking form, we will then email you a booking confirmation with a request to pay a \$500 deposit to ensure your place on the course.

If you need to cancel your course due to an emergency or work, be assured your course enrolment can be transferred to another date, course or person within a 12 month period.

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Fee payment

Course fees are to be **paid in full** prior to course commencement. You can pay by credit card, cash or by electronic funds transfer. Instalment payment plans are available on request.

Flexible course delivery

Participants may attend a full course or choose a "flexible delivery option" and attend days/weeks of the course over time and within a 2 year enrolment period. Depending on the course chosen, some days must be concurrent to ensure the participant meets the learning outcomes. The flexible delivery option must be discussed and approved by the Director prior to course commencement.

What to bring

Identification: Australian Drivers Licence, current passport or birth certificate, Unique Student Identifier (USI)

Sea Service: Please bring your evidence of qualifying sea service.
See the Record of Sea Service Form

RPL (if applying): Academic transcripts of previous qualifications, CV, letters from employers

Clothing: Work or casual clothes for both theory and practical days

Footwear: Deck shoes, joggers, sandshoes or work boots (no thongs)

Marine Radio day: 1 x Passport photo for LROCP Marine Radio course

Fight Fire day: No synthetic outer clothing, socks or underwear
Long sleeve 'cotton' work shirt
Long 'cotton' pants or jeans
Empty pockets, remove all contents; remove watch, jewellery and sunglasses
Hair is to be tied back, if applicable

Sea Survival day: In-water sea survival clothing to include a t-shirt or a long sleeve shirt plus long pants
Warm beanie or hat
Spare set of clothes to wear after sea survival in water practical
Lunch, a bottle of water, large towel, warm jacket, and strong large plastic bag for wet clothes
No jewellery allowed



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Certification

To receive the full qualification you must demonstrate competency in all units and meet all course requirements, **including qualification of the required sea service.**

If you don't achieve competency in some of the units, Sea School's Competency Not Achieved Assessment Policy allows you to return to attend specified classes to re-sit training and/or assessments at no cost within a 12 month period. Should you not complete the whole course then you will receive a statement of attainment for the units you've completed.

Obtaining your Certificate of Competency. Your final assessment is with AMSA.

Candidates are required to undertake a final assessment conducted by a National Regulator approved assessor before being issued a certificate of competency. Please read the AMSA guidance notice to ensure you meet the eligibility criteria before applying for your oral examination. Note: this qualification is only one of the components required to obtain your certificate of competency.

Course text

The definitive reference book for the Maritime industry and professional crew is the Australian Boating Manual by Dick Gandy. This is the course text and the cost is included in your course fees.

A study regime during the course is required.

Course structure

The Coxswain certificate is made up of 12 units of competency:

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- MARB002 Perform basic servicing, maintenance of main propulsion unit & auxiliary
- MARC005 Operate inboard and outboard motors
- MARC006 Operate main propulsion unit and auxiliary systems
- MARF001 Apply basic survival skills in the event of vessel abandonment
- MARF002 Follow procedures to minimise and fight fires on board a vessel
- MARF004 Meet work health and safety requirements
- MARF005 Survive at sea using survival craft
- MARH001 Plan and navigate a passage for a vessel up to 12 metres
- MARI001 Comply with regulations to ensure safe operation of a vessel up to 12 metres
- MARJ001 Follow environmental work practices
- MARK001 Handle a vessel up to 12 metres
- MARN002 Apply seamanship skills aboard a vessel up to 12 metres



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Credit Transfer and Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) is based on your work history, sea time and previous studies. If you can provide sufficient evidence (minimum currency 5 years) you can be granted RPL and you may be exempted from some of the coursework. A competency conversion conversation interview may be required as part of your evidence.

If you have completed a STCW95 or Elements of Shipboard Safety (ESS) course within the last 5 years, you will be eligible for a credit transfer or RPL of units that are included in Coxswain course structure. You must present evidence of course completion before a credit transfer can be granted.
